Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of [State name]

Public employee group health insurance plan; analysis.

No later than six months from the date of enactment of this act the [insert name of the state employee health plan/agency] shall conduct an analysis of the cost effectiveness of implementing a reference-based pricing and savings incentive program for current enrollees and retirees of public employee group health insurance plans. Any savings incentive program should directly reward patients who choose to receive care at more cost effective locations or from more cost effective providers. Savings incentives may include, but not be limited to, cash rewards, gift cards, health savings account contribution, credits or reductions of premiums, copayments, cost-sharing or deductibles.

The [agency] may issue a request for information from independent entities as part of the analysis. Such analysis should also give consideration to possible plan design changes when implementing a reference-based pricing program, and decision support options to help employees best navigate their care choices. If a reference-based pricing program is found to be cost effective, it shall be implemented as part of the next open enrollment. A report shall be issued within six months of the date of enactment of this act and shared with relevant legislative committees in writing explaining the decision and analysis of the agency.

Improving State Employee Health While Savings Taxpayer Dollars Act

Section 1.

Title

This Bill shall be entitled the "Improving State Employee Health and Saving Taxpayer Dollars Act."

Definitions.

(code) "Reference price" shall mean a flat payment paid by the Department in compensation for specific procedures or services performed by a healthcare provider.

- (c) Focus on shoppable services; and
- (c) Maximize cost savings for health benefit plan members and the health benefit plan
