Results for this poll were collected using a mixed-mode sampling frame that combined 513 responses from likely Utah voters via automated and live telephone interviews conducted by Cor Services, Inc.

The survey was conducted January 28-31, 20223. The margin of sampling error is ± 4.27 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement and the state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections was used to construct sample target weights.
